
THE MASTER PLAN

IN THE FORMULATION OF GIRTON'S MASTER PLAN, CAREFUL CONSIDERATION WAS GIVEN TO THE SCHOOL'S ORGANISING PRINCIPLES TO IDENTIFY THE FOLLOWING KEY OBJECTIVES:

- Creating an administrative hub to form the heart of each campus, providing easy access to student and staff facilities and a connection to the main street interface.
- Developing centres of disciplinary excellence around the school hub.
- Integrating landscape both within and around buildings to provide a natural campus backdrop.

- Providing opportunities for visible excellence by locating the most exciting learning spaces on ground floors. Students will have to pass these spaces to access upper levels.
- Increasing visibility across the disciplines in each building through extensive glazing between spaces.
- Strengthening the house system within each building of discipline with double height volumes as house gathering spaces.
- Potentially using the rooftops for learning areas, providing opportunities for additional green space and energy generation.
